THE STRANGEST DREAM

This is the story of Joseph Rotblat and the efforts of the Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs — which he founded — to halt nuclear proliferation. Nuclear physicist Joseph Rotblat was branded a traitor and spy after walking away from the Manhattan Project, whose aim was to build the first atomic bomb. With Bertrand Russell, he went on to help create the modern peace movement and eventually to win the Nobel Peace Prize. Featuring interviews with contemporaries of Rotblat, members of the Pugwash movement and passionate public figures including Senator Roméo Dallaire, *The Strangest Dream* demonstrates the renewed threat of nuclear weapons, while encouraging hope through the example of morally engaged scientists and citizens.
